8th Annual Computer-Based GL Assessment conducted

A total of 97 Year 4 students and 59 Year 6 students participated in the Granada Learning (GL) assessments. 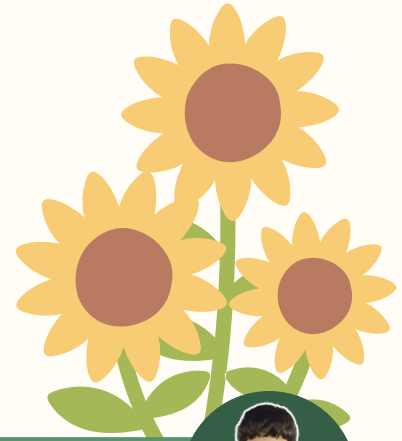
